





The quiet revolution in Asia's rice value chains

There is a rapid transformation afoot in the rice value chain in Asia. The upstream is changing quickly—farmers are undertaking capital-led intensification and participating in burgeoning markets for land rental, fertilizer and pesticides, irrigation water, and seed, and shifting from subsistence to small

commercialized farms; in some areas landholdings are concentrating.

agriculture is evolving towards a global system requiring high-quality, competitive products, and is organized in value chains which often exclude smallholders. It can also help value chains to be more inclusive, by making resources available for smallholders to be integrated

into higher value market opportunities.



Energy is central to irrigation, transportation, and all sustainable development efforts in developing countries. Without addressing energy, food security and poverty reduction are hard to achieve. 




Rice production response in Cambodia



STAPLE FOOD VALUE CHAINS: A QUIET REVOLUTION TAKING PLACE IN ASIA



Five years have passed since the 2007-2008 food crisis. Food prices still remain high and volatile. Ensuring long-term food security is still a great challenge, especially in Asia, where a third of the would's poor and malnourished population lives. Efforts to find solutions have been made by governments, international development agencies, researchers and all other stakeholders, however, very few empirical studies have been done in terms of the function and structure of staples supply chains that link producers and consumers in Asia.


